A huge thank you to Miss Griffiths for all her hard work, commitment and enthusiasm in preparing the choir and providing the children with such a fantastic experience.

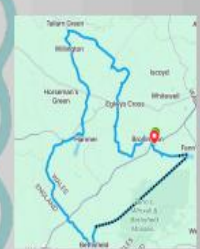

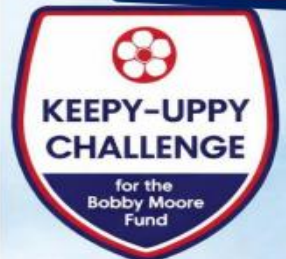
Hi My name is Will and I am 10 years old. I wanted to do something to help a cancer charity but didn't know what. Then I saw the Bobby Moore Keepy-Uppy Challenge and thought that is definitely something I can try.

Bobby Moore was a footballer and a legend who captained West Ham and led the England men's senior team to their first and only World Cup victory in 1966. Sadly, he was just 51 years old when he died. Shortly after his death in 1993, Bobby's widow Stephanie Moore OBE set up the Bobby Moore Fund to raise money for pioneering bowel cancer research. Since the fund was set up, bowel cancer mortality rates have fallen by over 30%. However, with 48 people losing their life to the disease every day in the UK, we still have a long way to go.

The challenge is to complete 100 keepy-uppies per day throughout the whole world cup competition. This charity challenge will help raise vital funds for cancer research and improve my own football skills at the same time!
