
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Our Road of progression display this half term is based on our work we complete on World Book Day based on the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit!

Year 4 and 5 pupils are going to see the performance on Friday afternoon.




Celebration Assembly

Just a reminder that the school gates open at 8:50am for the children to be in school for 9am.





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
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Something very excting happened in Dosbarth 2 this week!
