Another Fantastic 'Know Your Church' Workshop Day



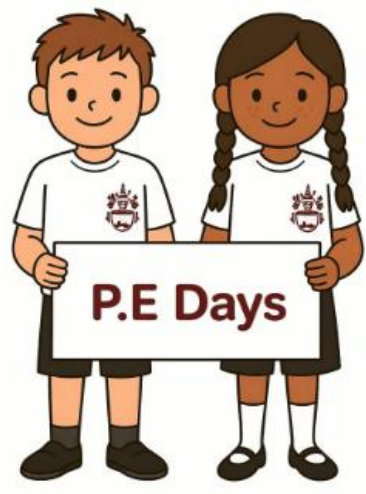

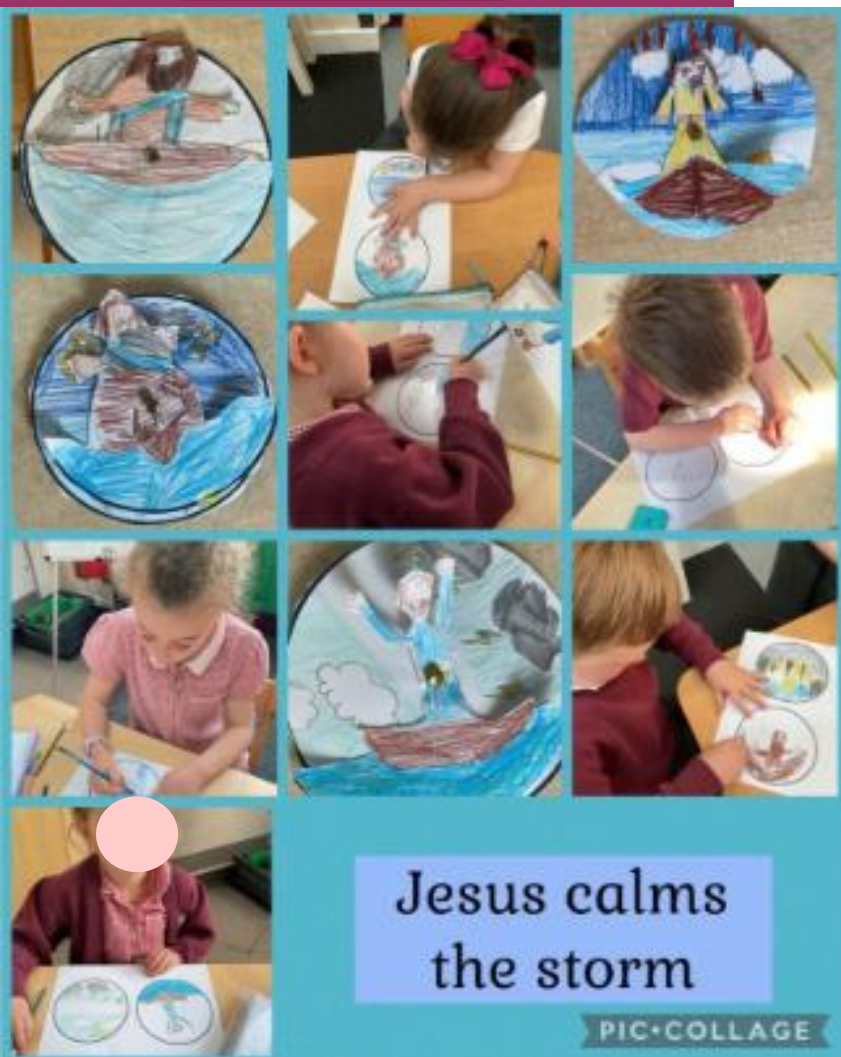

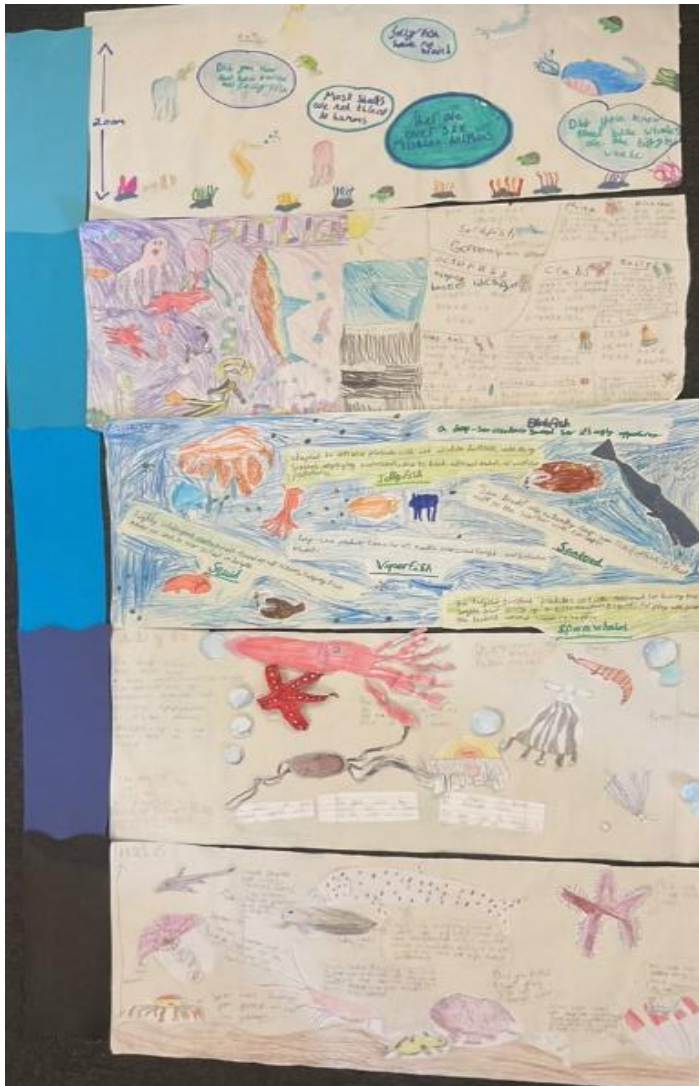
Class 2 enjoyed learning about the story of *Jesus Calms the Storm*.
